Find savings on teacher threads.

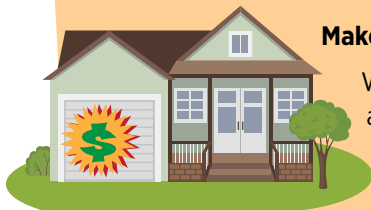

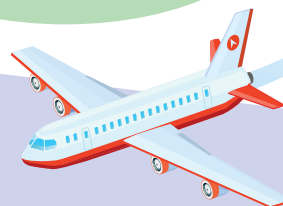

A Little Break

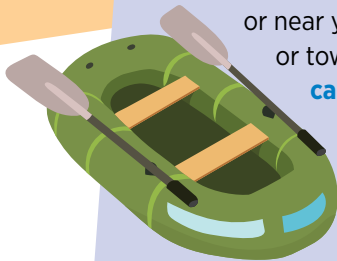
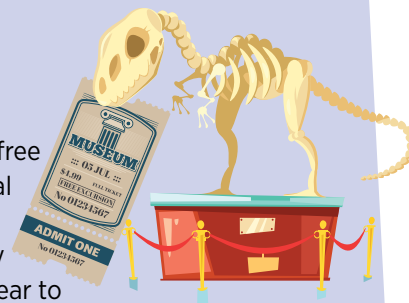
You deserve a vacation.

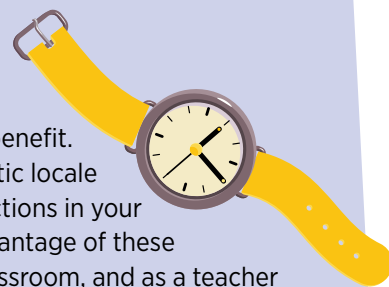
Or a staycation. . .

Upgrade your tech.

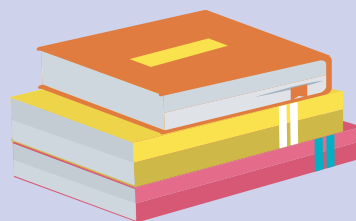
